

# Mandorah Marine Facilities

## Pontoon works: 18 – 31 May 2026

The Department of Logistics and Infrastructure will continue planned works on the ferry pontoon at the Mandorah Marine Facilities between 18 – 31 May 2026.

The routine pontoon post tensioning works are anticipated to take one week, weather permitting, and involve divers working off the ferry pontoon during daytime hours.

These works will be followed by a fendering upgrade, identified during the monitoring period, to accommodate a range of vessel sizes and improve berthing performance under varying marine conditions. The fendering works will be undertaken using various support vessels over a one week period.

There are no disruptions anticipated for the ferry service or major impacts to access to the ferry pontoon during this time as all pontoon works will be conducted in the period between ferry services. The contractor will be in continual communication with the SeaLink ferry during the works.

Flags will indicate the presence of divers and can be viewed in the [NT marine safety guide](#).

Recreational vessels are required to maintain a safe distance from a vessel or buoy displaying a dive flag and are reminded to stay clear of the ferry pontoon.

As part of the defects liability period for this custom designed and manufactured marine infrastructure, the facility will continue to be monitored and if necessary, adjusted during this period.

Contractors SMC Marine and Bellingham Marine will undertake the works and any future adjustments if required.
