

## Mandorah Marine Facilities

### Pontoon works: 12 – 24 January 2026

The Department of Logistics and Infrastructure will continue works on the ferry pontoon at the Mandorah Marine Facilities between 12 – 24 January 2026.

Following the commissioning period for the facilities, SMC Marine conducted initial routine pontoon post tensioning over a 10 day period earlier this month and is anticipated to re-commence these works on 12 January 2026.

The contractor will be adding boat fendering and the works are expected to take 2 weeks, weather permitting. The works involve divers working off the ferry pontoon during daytime hours.

There are no disruptions anticipated for the ferry service or impacts to access to the ferry pontoon during this time as the dive works will be conducted in the period between ferry services. The contractor will be in continual communication with the SeaLink ferry during the works.

Flags will indicate the presence of divers and can be viewed in the [NT marine safety guide](#).

Recreational vessels are required to maintain a safe distance from a vessel or buoy displaying a dive flag and are reminded to stay clear of the ferry pontoon.

As part of the defects liability period for this custom designed and manufactured marine infrastructure, the facility will continue to be monitored and if necessary, adjusted during this period.

Contractors SMC Marine and Bellingham Marine will undertake the works and any future adjustments if required.
